


Anti-Virus Software

Anti-virus software such as McAfee, Microsoft Security Essentials, or Windows Defender is used to detect, neutralize and eradicate malware (i.e., malicious software). It can also minimize other threats such as phishing attacks, worms, Trojan horses, and rootkits.

TIP #3 Strong Password

A secure password has at least 8 characters, which includes letters, numbers, and special characters. For example a strong password is "12earthWormS!". A weak password is "Password 1234".

TIP #4 3-2-1 Data Backup Rule

The most critical aspect of your computer is data. There are various causes of data loss, which may include hardware failure, data corruption, viruses, etc. Use the 3-2-1 rule: keep at least three (3) copies of your data, and store two (2) backup copies on different storage media, with one (1) of them located offsite.




TIP #5 Disk Clean-Up




TIP #6 Disk Defragmenter

Help speed up your computer with a Disk Defragmenter. It increases access speed by rearranging files stored on a disk. It is a computer maintenance utility included in Microsoft Windows. Please note: on Windows 10, Disk Defragmenter is known as Optimize Drives and it runs automatically.




Test Wi-Fi Connection

TERMS

Applications are types of software (also called "apps" and often used to refer to mobile device software) designed to provide a function for a user or another app. Apps include everything from web browsers, to word processors, to photo and image editing tools, to chat programs like Skype and Google Hangouts.

Bugs are coding mistakes or unwanted pieces of code that keep a website or program from working properly.

Cookies are small files that a Web server automatically sends to your PC when you browse certain Web sites. Cookies are stored as text files on your hard drive so servers can access them when you return to sites you've visited before.

Defrag to optimize your hard drive, usually with a program that "cleans it up" and makes it run as smoothly as possible.

Ethernet cable is one of the most common forms of network cables used on wired networks. Ethernet cables connect devices within a local area network, like PCs, routers, and switches.

Firewalls are systems designed to protect and secure a computer network—everything from a commercial web service to your home Wi-fi network—from external security risks. Firewalls monitor inbound and outbound network traffic and determine whether to allow the traffic through based on a user-defined set of security standards.

Keywords are words or phrases commonly used in search engines to look for online content. Keyword research is a powerful internet marketing tool, since web advertising and website search engine placement can be optimized to match high traffic keywords, making it more likely that Googlers will end up on your site.

TERMS

Operating System is the primary software that manages all the hardware and other software on a computer. The operating system, also known as an "OS," interfaces with the computer's hardware and provides services that applications can use.

Routers are the devices used to connect personal computers to the internet via a service provider like cable or DSL. The device that your computer is either directly connected to via an ethernet cable or that you use to access your home Wi-fi network is a router.

Software is a program or set of instructions that instructs a computer, phone, or tablet to take specific actions. Software includes individual applications (web browsers, word processors) as well as system software like operating systems (Microsoft Windows), drivers (software that allows operating systems to communicate with hardware like printers), and utilities (tools like anti-virus programs or hard drive defragmenters).

User is a term that defines the online audience. It also refers to anyone who "uses" a computer. The term "users" rubs some people the wrong way because, in the past, if you said you were a user, it meant you were habitually consuming an illicit drug. Nowadays, a user is a person who is online. It comes from techies, who refer to people as "computer users."

Web apps are websites that look and feel like an app (as opposed to a series of linked pages). Facebook, Pandora, and Google Docs are all examples of web apps.

Wi-Fi is the name of a wireless networking technology that uses radio waves to provide high-speed network and Internet connections.
